RNN Group Students Transform Community Garden

A powerful partnership between RNN Group students and Esh Construction has helped revitalise a community garden for Lighthouse Homes – a Rotherhambased charity supporting men facing homelessness, poverty, and substance abuse.

The redevelopment project, completed in time for spring, aims to boost mental wellbeing and encourage outdoor activity for the residents of the 17-bed hostel on Westgate, which offers 24/7 support for men aged 18 and over.

A dedicated team of students from the RNN Group volunteered their time and skills to support the project. They worked alongside industry professionals from Esh Construction to upcycle benches, install sleepers, lay paving, and create a sustainable green space that will benefit residents for years to come.

Patience Middleton, an RNN Group student who took part in the project, said:

"I have really enjoyed participating in practical activities on site, as it has allowed me to work outside of my comfort zone and given me valuable knowledge and skills by working with industry specialists.

Completing this project with the Esh team has given me an insight into how to work together to complete a project, and I feel confident that I can take what I have learnt on site into my future career."

Martin Haigh, Support Manager at Lighthouse Homes, expressed his gratitude for the collaborative effort:

"The provision of a quiet green space is an essential part of what we offer to our residents in Rotherham. We are very grateful to Esh Construction for the work done and the way they did it. They minimised disruption and were polite and courteous at every contact we have had with them."

Megan Roberts, Social Value Manager at Esh Construction, added:

"The facilities at Lighthouse Homes are incredible. Their work to help young men in the local community is invaluable, and the new garden will provide them with the opportunity to further enhance the support that they offer.

Esh is committed to delivering social value initiatives like this one in the local areas where we are operating. The work that we do is long-term, to create a legacy, and we hope that the new garden will provide support to the residents for many years to come."

Rotherham Council also praised the partnership. Councillor Sarah Allen, Cabinet Member for Housing, said:

"We are extremely grateful for the work that Esh Construction and the RNN students have completed for the residents at Lighthouse Homes, as the benefits they will gain from the new garden are endless.

Lighthouse Homes, as evidenced by this particular project, is really important to us. We have a rough sleeper and homelessness strategy for the borough, and Lighthouse Homes make an important contribution to this."

This project reflects the power of community collaboration and the value of hands-on learning for students.

It not only enhanced a vital local service but also gave RNN students an opportunity to build skills and contribute to lasting social impact in their town.

HN Flex: A new Approach to Higher Education

HN Flex is a new, modular higher education offering, designed to make higher-level learning more accessible, customisable, and career-focused.

It enables learners to study individual units from BTEC Higher National qualifications at Levels 4 and 5 across more than 40 subject areas, including engineering, computing, business, and creative industries.

This flexible model is ideal for professionals looking to upskill, individuals transitioning careers, or those who prefer a more incremental approach to education.

Learners can enrol in stand-alone units, combine units for CPD (Continuing Professional Development), or work towards full qualifications like the HNC (Higher National Certificate) or HND (Higher National Diploma).

Upon completion of each unit, learners earn a Certificate of Unit Credit (CoUC), which can be used to build toward a full award in the future.

Learners can choose from several pathways

- •Study stackable units within a single BTEC Higher National qualification, with the opportunity to progress to a Higher National Certificate (HNC) or Higher National Diploma (HND), achieving a Certificate of Unit Credit (CoUC) upon completion.
- •Combine up to four units from different BTEC Higher National subjects as standalone short programmes. While these units cannot be combined to create an HNC/HND, students have the opportunity to progress to a full HNC/HND, focusing on a single subject discipline, having banked the units studied.
- Complete individual units of CPD as and when required.
- Complete only units required for professional body or vendor accreditation.

For educational institutions, HN Flex offers the ability to attract a broader student base, including adult learners and professionals seeking targeted skill development. It also facilitates stronger partnerships with local employers by addressing specific workforce training needs.

What we offer at the RNN Group

From September, RNN Group's Higher Education offering at the University Centre Rotherham includes HN Flex courses including in Business, Construction, Digital and Engineering, alongside HTQs, HNCs, HNDs, Higher and Degree Level Apprenticeships and traditional degrees including a Masters option in Teaching alongside the PGCE option (both full or part time) too.

HN Flex will provide learners with a versatile and accessible route to acquire higher-level skills in a manageable format, supporting both immediate professional goals and longterm educational aspirations.

Rotherham's Children's Capital of Culture is more than a title – it's a statement of belief in the power of young people to transform the places they live. It's also a model for how towns across the UK can invest in youth-led regeneration, culture, and pride of place.
